Trainer/Presenter: In collaboration between MMRMA and the Public Agency Training Council [PATC], the course

will be taught by Tyler Sutherland who has been a police officer for over 19 years with the Battle Creek Police Department. Tyler is currently assigned to his department's detective bureau and has served in many capacities during his tenure. Tyler has also qualified, and testified as a gang

expert, in Federal and State Courts.

Description: This two-day training program is designed to improve the skills, awareness, and preparation

needed for courtroom testimony. Day One provides students with testimony preparation through report writing, use of force, search and seizure, and interview/interrogations. Day Two teaches defense attorney tactics, mental preparation, mock preliminary testimony, and the impact your

testimony has on closing arguments.

Training Objectives: After completion of training, the attendee will be able to:

• Recognize testimony mistakes.

 Recognize report writing challenges and the importance of documenting crime scene details.

• Control emotions during testimony.

Identify defense attorney tactics.

Understand expert witness testimony
